CAL 6001 Philosophy and Ideology of Human Rights December 2020 (webinars)

Instructions about the Oral Debate

- 1.Each debating exercise shall involve two students. These debates will take place in the lectures from 10-16 December 2020 in Zoom. Students are assigned their specific topic (including whether they are for or against the statement) and allocated the time of the presentation (see the schedule).
- 2.Each student will have about **8 minutes** to present his or her position (*make sure to time your presentation beforehand!*). Each presentation shall be followed by **5 minutes of questions** from the lecturers and other students (the Q&A session). Afterwards, the examiners will give some feedback to both students about their performance. The presentation will be graded by the lectures and count for 15% of the final grade.
- 3. The students have to present arguments supporting their side in the debate question. Having to defend a specific view is common practice, if one is working as a State official, a lawyer, an NGO activist, or other human rights professional.
- 4. The student performance in the debate will be graded according to the grading scale of the Course.
- 5. The three main guidelines for assessing the student performance in the debate will be the ability of the student:
 - To clarify the conceptual issues involved and articulate the different types of arguments by drawing on the main disciplines in the course law, political and social sciences, and philosophy.
 - To form a coherent and convincing argument, while at the same time demonstrating credibility in dealing with opposing views and any questions posed by the lecturers.
 - To present the arguments in an understandable and clear manner (good introduction, structured arguments and signposting, conclusion).
- 6. In order to pass this course, the students need to pass the oral debate exam.
